GOALS / OBJECTIVES

NESA 60 is intended to increase the participants knowledge base in subject areas effecting physician and caregivers performance that could possibly impede patient care. Many physicians who know about burnout do not recognize the signs and symptoms of burnout nor the impact these have on delivering the best patient care. In addition, NESA 60 will discuss how physician bias in decision making can lead to non-optimal decisions. Understanding and recognizing this is the first step in learning how to provide better care through cooperative, team making decisions. Lastly, NESA 60 will explain how surgical home is developing and can address the demands of an increasing population of frail, elderly patients.

Discuss physician burnout and provide a survey of the reasons precipitating the problem, its impact on patient care, and how it can be approached by physicians, their departments and their institutions. Pursuant this discussion, the course will introduce a new discipline, performance coaching for practicing healthcare professionals.

Evaluate the complexities of team communication by exploring the ORs and the ICUs use of definable stops in the decision-making behavior surrounding team communication, and promoting the role of emotion management for reframing and improving patient care by promoting team decision making through fidelity to facts in an unbiased way.

Explicate the differences between animal data and human data regarding neurotoxicity in pediatric anesthesia, and how to interpret and respond to parents in light of the FDA's Safe Drug Communication.

Identify how cerebral auto-regulation and blood pressure changes with pediatric age and growth and apply this to prevent hypotension and hypocarbia from leading to cerebral injury.

Describe the concept of the frail elderly as differentiated from the healthy elderly, and explore the varied views of frailty and how outcomes are different at various post-surgical/anesthetic times (one day, 30 days, 1 year), and recommend how to improve results in a compassionate and responsible way. The concept of The Geriatric Surgical Home will be introduced and a specific example of how this has been approached at one surgical service at one hospital.

Identify new drugs, old drugs used in new ways, and anticipated drugs in trial that can be used in ambulatory surgery and expand the repertoire of surgeries in ambulatory surgery, broadening the selection of patients who can undergo surgery safely (i.e. the intersection of disease burden and surgical trespass).
